# 4. ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS/ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS Non-Action

A. Athletic report given by Matt Klafehn on behalf of Rick Arket. Three of our four varsity teams earned scholar athlete distinction for the winter season. The boys' volleyball, girls' basketball, and swim team each had students with a 90 or above average. Spring games are slated to begin the first week of April.

B. District update was given by Superintendent McGraw. Sheriff David Bartlett was present to answer questions regarding a School Resource Deputy proposal.

#### Action

Board member Wood made the motion to authorize Superintendent McGraw to enter into an agreement with the Columbia County Sheriff's Department

for a School Resource Deputy. Board member Sotek seconded. 5 ayes, 0 nays, 0 abstained.

#### Non-Action

C. Business office/facilities and grounds update given by Michael Los. Work on the bus garage has begun. The electricians have been working for several weeks and have made substantial progress. The plumbers are currently scanning existing pipes under the bus garage floor to determine the full scope of work. They are currently on schedule and all work is expected to be completed by the end of the school year. Included in the financial portion of this meeting is a projected fund balance for this current year ending June 30, 2014. Although still early in the school year, he is projecting a surplus of \$212,000 at the end of the fiscal year. Based on this projection, there is a budget transfer included for \$38,000 for replacing the bleachers in the high school gym. He plans to elaborate further during the budget presentation on the use of fund balance and how it fits into a long term plan for the district.

D. WBH update given by Leslie Whitcomb. Valene Synakowski arranged for our participation in SPAC Classical Kids. This consists of a one hour ballet assembly for grade 5, in preparation for July's attendance at the Bolshoi Ballet performance; a one hour symphony assembly for grade 6, in preparation for the August attendance at Cirque de la Symphony concert. A cellist from the Philadelphia Symphony Orchestra came and visited students to help entice them to attend. Concert attendance is free, additional family members can attend at a half price if they purchase the tickets in advance. One 6<sup>th</sup> grade class has visited the JSHS 7<sup>th</sup> grade core teachers in preparation for 7<sup>th</sup> grade.

E. Jr/Sr High School update given by Matthew Klafehn. Power of Peace is a program he learned about in a Principal's meeting at Questar III. Meghan Pepe, researched the program and brought the workshop to New Lebanon. Students stopped him in the hallways to tell him how awesome the experience was. Students in Michelle Daus' Advanced Foods class journeyed to the Times Union newspaper where they met with Steve Barnes, a food columnist/blogger, and with Greg Stapleton, who oversees the newspaper's distribution. They were given a tour of the facility and were shown the new state-of-the-art printing press. After the Times Union, the students enjoyed the "Koto Experience" where many students had their first hibachi meal. The English 12 students, members of the Senior Choir and Drama Club went to New York City for a Broadway workshop. The students saw "After Midnight" and worked with actual actors from the production. The Drama Club performed "Loving Lives" on February 26th. The comedy was based upon a radio show on its last legs in the late 1940s. Meghan Pepe hosted FAFSA night this month, where parents learned how to complete Financial Aid Forms for students attending college. The transition to HS night for incoming ninth graders will be held on March 25th for the purposes of preparing students for high school programming and the credit bearing years.

One half of our 6<sup>th</sup> grade, along with Hancock students, shadowed seventh graders in the Junior High School. The other half of our 6th grade will do the same in May after state testing. On Thursday, March 27th, from 6:00-7:30 pm, the High School will be hosting a dinner in appreciation of our international students and their host families. The meal will be provided by students in our Appetites Anonymous club and will be of no cost. Also invited are interested parties who may be interested in hosting an international student for the upcoming school year. March has been designated in the ISHS as Observe a Colleague Month- teachers are being encouraged to view the practice of their colleagues for the purpose of identifying new strategies, reflecting on practice, and aligning curriculum. English Language Arts testing for grades 7 and 8 will take place April 1-3. Kara Siciliano was featured in a News Channel 13 teacher of the week clip. Meghan Pepe was selected for the NYSED School Counselor Summit to be held on April 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>. Jennifer Allard was selected as recipient of the 2014 New York State Council for the Social Studies Outstanding Social Studies High School Classroom Teacher Award.
