#### 4. ACKNOWLEDEMENTS/ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS

A. Jr/Sr High School update was presented by Matthew Klafehn. The Travel Club visited Spain and Morocco over the April break. Advisors Kara Siciliano and Patricia White, along with student voyagers talked about their experience. The Travel Club and the classes of 2015 and 2017 will be putting on a Spring Fling Community Carnival on Friday, May 16, from 3:00-8:00pm at Shatford Park. The money raised will support their next excursion to Costa Rica. On April 14, 2014, Governor Cuomo announced New York State Master Teachers, which recognizes out-standing middle and high school teachers in the STEM subjects. Dolores Storey, high school math teacher, was selected for the program. Eleven students were inducted into the National Honor Society last week. Last week Grade 7 and 8 Math testing

took place. Grade 8 Science will be on June 2. The Columbia County Sheriffs were invited to the faculty meeting and presented on drug identification. Prom will take place on Saturday, May 9, at Muscatello's. Junior High academic awards night will be held on May 13th, and the High School academic awards night will be on May 20th, both at 6:30. The Spring Concert will take place on May 21st at 7:00. The Memorial Day assembly will take place on May 23, at 9:00 am.

- B. Student Representative update was given by Usman Sadiq. The travel club's trip to Spain and Morocco is now over. It was a chance to experience new cultures. The AP calculus test is now over. Ms. Norberg's graphic communications classes are learning how to code HTML. Students are creating their own websites. Usman left at 8:22pm
- C. Business Office/Facilities and Grounds presented by Michael Los. Bus garage work is progressing and is still expected to be completed by summer. Additionally, the pool bathroom work has started and is also expected to be completed before the summer swim program.
- D. WBH update given by Leslie Whitcomb. Art Story, supported by the Everett Kelley endowment for Columbia County arts, will be in 3rd and 4th grade classrooms five days this month. The goal is to use visual images to understand content. The 5th grade SPAC assembly was very well received. The PTA brought in the "Science Guy" who presented two hands-on fun events related to flight. Trivia night was well attended. Teams consisted of members from both schools as well as many from the community. It netted about \$1600 for the New Lebanon Foundation. The play Beauty and the Beast was also well attended. The students enjoyed their cast party after school. WBH had a talent show last month. Many of the students had been preparing their performances since the fall with Miss Boyce in the Show Choir Club - a new club offered to provide opportunities for most motivated singers to have more opportunities to practice outside of choir. The second half of 6th grade students will have their trip to the ISHS. May and June are huge months for field trips. Students are going to the NYS Museum, Firefighters Museum, Palace Theater, and Dutch Hollow among other places. 5th graders will take their traditional trip to Nature's Classroom during the first week in June and the 6th graders will have a full-day trip during that week to the Science Museum and Medieval Times in New Jersey. NYSED testing will soon conclude with a science field test as well as the formal performance and written test.
- E. Athletic report. The Spring season is drawing to a close. Varsity and modified sports will be wrapping up within the next 2 weeks. Connor Feathers broke the school record in the 1600M. He ran it in 4:40. A memo regarding JV and cuts was discussed.
- F. Special Education update given by Superintendent McGraw (Tamara Thorpe-Odom absent) The CSE Department is holding annual reviews. Last

week, Special Education staff attended training in Saratoga as a team on IEP alignment with program goals and services. Summer school staff has been selected, curriculum planning is being planned, and summer school invites are being sent to parents this week. Outside summer placements and fall placements meetings have been held. She pleased with student's continuous academic and social progress.
